

Making a difference one train journey at a time

An average train journey puts nearly five times less carbon emissions into the air than making this journey by car.

A person travelling in an average car produces 0.167kg CO₂e per km (based on the average emissions of all cars on the road of various types and engines), while National Rail trains on average produce 0.035kg CO₂e per passenger per km. This means the average car is 4.7 times (nearly 5 times) more polluting.
